

Learn how to locate vital records on a county or state level and what regional resources such as libraries and historical societies have to offer.

HISTORIC FURNITURE AND INTERIORS —Julie Thomas Sat. 8-5

Learn how historic homes were furnished, the different styles of furniture and the use of window and floor treatments to finish a room. Fee \$70

TIMBERFRAMING TECHNIQUES — Kevin Wilson Sat. 8-5 Nov. TBA

Understanding historic building technology prior to 1820s using timberframing techniques including mortice and tenon construction. Students will complete a small project. **Fee \$70.**

MASONRY - SAT. 9-5 TBA

Students will learn about repointing, repairing masonry elements like piers, chimneys, or foundations and understand traditional lime mortar. **Fee \$ 70.**

INTRODUCTION TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION – Scott Power & John Wood. Sat 8-5 (1 CEU) An overview of historic preservation laws on state and national levels, guidelines for setting up historic districts, an overview of the National Register of Historic Places, and discussion of tax credits for renovating historic properties. Fee \$70

Note – All classes will meet on the Tarboro campus of Edgecombe Community College.

For all hands on courses using tools students will need to sign a liability waver with an option of purchasing insurance through the college for \$10 per semester. Fees are subject to legislative changes. Current courses are \$70 per class through continuing education.
