### Introduction

The North Carolina Community College System Office presents *The NC Community College System 2023-2024 Scholarship Guide: Eligibility Criteria and Guidelines for Scholarship Administration*.

This guide covers the scope of scholarships from state, corporate and private sponsors for North Carolina community college students. This is an informational guide for financial aid administrators, scholarship coordinators and support staff working with students attending a NC community college. I encourage financial aid administrators, scholarship coordinators, support staff and business officers to use this guide as a resource to assist in meeting the financial needs of students attending a community college.

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### **Guidelines for Administering NCCCS Scholarship Programs**

### The responsibilities of the community college under the scholarship program are to:

- 1. Advertise and promote the availability of scholarship programs in its service area.
- 2. Establish a scholarship committee to select recipients and alternates based on specific scholarship criteria.
- 3. Submit student information on the templates provided by the NC Community College System Office as requested to meet the reporting deadline.
- 4. Coordinate publicity efforts for all scholarship announcements.
- 5. Notify recipient(s) of scholarship(s) award offer.
- Notify NCCCS of scholarship recipients who did not enroll, withdrew, or otherwise did not meet eligibility requirements for the award. NCCCS will inform if the funds should be returned including how to return funds.
- 7. Notify NCCCS of a student's enrollment and eligibility as required and for disbursement of scholarship funds.
- 8. May select alternate(s) for certain scholarships if the selected recipient is no longer eligible. Colleges must adhere to scholarship requirements as all scholarships may not allow alternates, therefore resulting in returning funds to the respective agency or to NCCCS.
- 9. Colleges should return unexpended funds to NCCCS for the following scholarship programs:
  - NC Community Colleges Health Careers Scholarship
  - Wells Fargo Technical Scholarship

### **NCCCS Responsibilities for Scholarship Administration**

### The responsibilities of the System Office under the scholarship programs are to:

- 1. Compile a master list of the scholarship recipients from the 58 community colleges for each scholarship program.
- 2. Submit to the Finance Office or the NC Community College Foundation a listing of scholarship recipients and check request for payment to the college on behalf of the student.
- 3. The Finance Office or the NC Community College Foundation will disburse all scholarship payments to the college Financial Aid Office.
- 4. Report on a schedule or as required by the agency required reports if requested information including but not limited to recipient directory, expenditure of scholarship funds and outcomes associated with the scholarship program.
- Assist colleges in administering scholarship funds by providing college allocations and payment schedules, communicate timelines for awarding and deadlines for scholarship maintenance and reporting.
- 6. Provide professional development and outreach to colleges in collaboration with scholarship donors and agencies.
- 7. Regularly monitor and manage all scholarship programs.

### **NC Scholarship Program for Community Colleges**

Session Law 2021-180, Section 8A.2.(a) directed the public colleges and universities need-based financial aid consolidation. This consolidation resulted in the North Carolina Need-Based Scholarship for Public Colleges and Universities and established the Scholarship Reserve Fund for Public Colleges and Universities. Beginning in FY 2023-24, within the funds available, the North Carolina State Education Assistance Authority (NCSEAA) shall administer and allocate the scholarship. In collaboration with the NC Community College System, NCSEAA will set the annual community college payment schedule.

NEW: Formally known as the North Carolina Need-Based Scholarship for Public Colleges and Universities, is referred to as the "NC Scholarship Program". The program was authorized by the North Carolina General Assembly in 2021 to provide financial assistance to needy NC resident students attending eligible colleges and universities located within the State of North Carolina, beginning with the 2023-2024 academic year. Directed by the General Assembly, the State Education Assistance Authority (SEAA) administers the program pursuant with the Act and the NC Scholarship Program rules. Each eligible college and university play a role in administering the scholarships for the eligible students that it enrolls. The Authority administers the program as directed by the General Assembly, and funding for scholarships is generally contingent on appropriations made available to the Authority for the program.

### **Student Eligibility Requirements:**

- A student is eligible to receive the scholarship for an academic year at the institution where the student is enrolled, or admitted for enrollment, determines that the student meets the following requirements:
- Submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
- Demonstrates need based on the FAFSA.
- Qualifies as a NC resident for tuition purposes in accordance with the coordinated and centralized residency determination process administered by the Authority, at the time of enrollment at the college.
- Is in a Matriculated Status as an undergraduate student at the college.
- Has complied with the registration requirements of the Military Selective Service Act or is exempt from the registration requirements.
- Is eligible to receive financial assistance under the Title IV of the Highter Education Act of 1965, as amended.
- Is not in default under any State loan or grant program.
- Must meet satisfactory academic progress standards as determined by the college.
- Meets any other enrollment standards jointly established by the President of the University of North Carolina and the President of the North Carolina Community College System President.

### **Limitation on Eligibility:**

- An eligible student may not receive the NC Scholarship or a scholarship or grant from any combination of the other State Funded Need-Based Financial Aid Programs for more than ten (10) full-time semesters, or the equivalent if enrolled part-time, or if the student is enrolled in a program officially designated by the postsecondary institution as a five-year degree program, twelve (12) full-time academic semesters, or the equivalent if enrolled part-time, unless the institution has granted the student a waiver for up to one additional equivalent full-time academic semester.
- While matriculating at a community college, an eligible student may not receive a scholarship for more than six (6) full-time academic semesters, or the equivalent if enrolled part-time, unless the student has been granted a waiver for up to one additional equivalent full-time academic semester.

### **College Requirements and Responsibilities:**

- Designating an authorized school official as the primary contact between the institution and the Authority and charging that person with the primary responsibility for executing the responsibilities of the institution under the program rules.
- Complying with the scholarship disbursement procedures.
- Complying with the refund procedures.
- Certifying, in a manner acceptable to the Authority, that an applicant meets the eligibility requirements for a scholarship under the program rules.

### **NC Targeted Assistance and Less Than Half-Time Grant Program**

Each year the State Board of Community Colleges is asked to approve \$500,000 in awards to NC community colleges to be used for the Targeted Assistance and Less Than Half-Time Grant programs. Each college has an allocation based on a formula that considers a base allotment of \$1000. The remaining funds are allocated on a pro-rata basis as determined by each college's percentage of total of the previous year's Pell Grant disbursements. Note: Allocations are subject to change based on the prior year's Pell Grant disbursements.

NC Targeted Assistance and Less Than Half-Time Grant assistance can be used to offer financial assistance to students who (1) enroll in low-enrollment programs to prepare for high demand occupations, (2) have disabilities and have been referred by the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation, or (3) enroll on a less than half-time basis.

In July 2011, the State Board of Community Colleges consolidated the NC Targeted Assistance and Less Than Half-Time Grant programs.

### The North Carolina Targeted Assistance and Less Than Half-Time Grant Programs

G.S. 115D-40.1 (b), the "State Board may provide financial assistance to the following students:

- (1) Students who enroll in low-enrollment programs that prepare students for high-demand occupations.
- (2) Students with disabilities who have been referred by the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Vocational Rehabilitation, and are enrolled in a community college".
- (3) Students enrolled in fewer than six credit hours per semester who otherwise qualify for need-based financial aid programs.

### Best Practices and Policies for the Targeted Assistance and Less Than Half-Time Grant Programs

- The State Board may allocate a percentage of the funds appropriated for financial assistance for community college students to students who enroll in low enrollment programs that prepare students for high-demand occupations.
- The local community colleges shall identify programs with enrollment that is substantially less than program capacities but are in high demand based on employee needed in the service area labor forces.
- For students enrolled through the sponsorship of the NC Division of Vocational Rehabilitation (VR), colleges may apply these funds to the cost of the in-state tuition rate less the tuition payment authorized by VR.
- Certificate, diploma, and associate degree students must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to be eligible for this need based financial assistance.
- Funds allocated to the community colleges for this program include a base rate plus a percentage as determined by the colleges' Pell funds awarded and listed in the most recent final NCHED A-10 report of the community college system data warehouse.
- Colleges will report to the System Office after June 30th each year: a) the number of students

funded, b) a listing of the credit and noncredit programs where funds were targeted, c) and the number of students assisted by enrollment status funds including number of completers, the number of continuing student and (3) the amount of unexpended funds.

- For Less Than Half-Time Grant program, college may offer up to \$76 per semester hour and up to a maximum of up to \$380 to cover tuition. For students enrolled through the sponsorship of the NC Division of Vocational Rehabilitation, this grant may cover the cost of in-state tuition less any tuition payment received from Voc Rahab.
- Qualified students in programs that are ineligible for federal financial assistance (non-Title IV eligible) may be eligible for \$76 per semester hour up to \$380 to cover tuition. For students enrolled through the sponsorship of the NC Division of Vocational Rehabilitation, this grant may cover the cost of in-state tuition less any tuition payment received from Voc Rahab.
- Colleges will report to the System Office each year after June 30<sup>th</sup>, the scholarship/grant recipients, amount and term of award, program enrolled in and amount of expended and unexpended funds. All unexpended funds must be returned to the System Office by June 30<sup>th</sup>.

### North Carolina Community College Foundation Special Recognition Scholarship

The North Carolina Community College Foundation Special Recognition Scholarship was created to recognize outstanding efforts of students representing disability identity and in honor of those that have served our country. The NCCCS Foundation will provide seven (7) scholarships of up to \$1000 for curriculum students and four (4) scholarships of up to \$750 for workforce continuing education students. The scholarship may help cover the cost of tuition, fees, books, supplies, assistive technology, transportation, childcare and other components of the total cost of attendance for 2023-24.

Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 states that "a person with a disability includes…any person who (1) has a physical or mental impairment which substantially limits one or more major life activities {including walking, seeing, hearing, speaking, breathing, learning, working, caring for oneself, and performing manual tasks}, (2) has a record of such an impairment, or (3) is regarded as having such an impairment.

### **Curriculum (CU) Student Eligibility Criteria**

- Be a resident of North Carolina.
- Completion of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for 2023-24.
- Complete the NCCCF Special Recognition Scholarship application.
- Submit an essay explaining your interest in the degree program, your goals after graduation and how the scholarship will help you financially.
- Maintain a cumulative grade point average at or above the level required for graduation.
- Enroll or plan to enroll full-time. An applicant with an exception to the full-time requirement as an accommodation to access services and/or maintain eligibility for insurance or other benefits may not be disqualified. If enrolled part-time under the advisement from disability services, a statement from the disability service staff stating that status is due to an accommodation.
- Present proof of documented disability (may work with Disabilities Services at the college to obtain this information) or self-identify as an individual with a disability.

### **Workforce Continuing Education (WCE) Student Eligibility Criteria**

- Be a resident of North Carolina.
- Complete the NCCCF Special Recognition Scholarship application.
- Submit an essay explaining your interest in the pathway/courses, your goals after completion of the pathways/courses and how the scholarship will help you financially.
- Enrolling in Workforce Continuing Education (WCE) pathways/courses offered for 96 hours or more and leading to a state or industry recognized credential.
- Present proof of documented disability (must work with Disabilities Services at the college to obtain this
  information and Disabilities Services must sign off on the application.

Factors considered in the selection process include but are not limited to financial need, scholastic achievement, or career goals. Scholarship candidates shall be selected, and the scholarships awarded without regard to race, gender, color, creed, religious preference, age, national origin, or disability.

### The North Carolina Community Colleges Foundation Scholarship for Health Careers Application

### **Health Careers Student Eligibility Criteria**

The North Carolina Community Colleges Foundation Scholarships for Health Careers were created to assist students interested in attaining associate degrees in fields of high demand that will allow them to join the health care profession. The scholarships are available to full time students with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 enrolled in the second year of an eligible Allied Health program at a community college.

All applicants must have completed the Free Application of Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The Foundation awards \$1,000 scholarships, \$500 for the fall and spring semesters. Disbursement of the spring awards is contingent upon enrollment and satisfactory academic performance during the fall semester.

- Dental Hygiene (A45260)
- Emergency Medical Science (A45340)
- Health Information Technology (A45360)
- Medical Assisting (A45400)
- Medical Laboratory Technology (A45400)
- Pharmacy Technology (A45580)
- Physical Therapist Assistant (2-year program)
- Physical Therapist Assistant (1+1) (A45640)
- Respiratory Therapy (A45720)
- Veterinary Medical Technology (A45780)

Scholarship recipients will be selected by a committee of NC Community College representatives. The committee will consider financial need as demonstrated by the Free Application for Federal Student Assistance (FAFSA), merit as determined by academic performance, and personal commitment to the health profession, as determined by the required documentation.

The head of the college's Allied Health Department will need to complete the general scholarship application for the recommended student and submit it to the Financial Aid Office. Scholarship deadline is Friday, September 15, 2023.

### **Additional Applicant Requirements:**

**Provide career goals and relevant experience:** On a separate sheet (limit 500 words), have the student explain what their career goals are. Students should describe volunteer work, family care, awards, or other life experiences which demonstrate their commitment to the health field as a vocation. *Please attack the student's response to the above question.* 

**Transcripts:** Please include an unofficial or official transcript from the community college in which student is enrolled.

### **Wells Fargo Technical Scholarship Program**

### **Wells Fargo Technical Student and College Requirements**

Each college will receive a \$500 disbursement for the Wells Fargo Technical Scholarship Program. The scholarship should be awarded and paid to an eligible student(s) in two payments: fall semester, \$250; and spring semester, \$250. If a student does not return in the spring semester and/or no longer meets eligibility requirements, the Wells Fargo Technical Scholarship may be awarded to another student who meets the eligibility criteria.

### **Student Eligibility Requirements:**

- 1. Be a full-time student enrolled in the second year of a two-year educational/technical program.
- 2. Demonstrate financial need.
- 3. Meet satisfactory academic progress standards as determined by the college.
- 4. Use the scholarship to pay for tuition and fees, books and supplies, and/or transportation up to the cost of attendance.

### **College Requirements:**

- 1. The college may select a student(s) who meets the criteria for the Wells Fargo Technical Scholarship.
- 2. The college may establish a scholarship committee to select the recipient(s) for the scholarship. The committee may include a chairperson and others as selected by the college.
- 3. Colleges may be asked to provide scholarship recipients to the NCCCS Foundation if requested.
- 4. All unexpended funds for this scholarship program must be returned to NCCCS Foundation by June 30, 2024.





### **Eligibility Guidelines and Student Application**

The Golden LEAF Foundation makes scholarships available to students from qualifying counties who demonstrate financial need to help them attend a North Carolina community college. Golden LEAF's goal is for scholarship recipients to gain talent, knowledge, and the skills to help their communities thrive.

The Golden LEAF Community College Scholarship provides scholarships of up to \$2,250 annually for curriculum students and up to \$1850 annually for workforce continuing education students. The scholarships help cover the cost of tuition, fees, books, supplies, credentialing tests, transportation, childcare and other components of the total cost of attendance for the 2023-2024 academic year.

### **NCCCS Requirements**

- Notify the college of their allocation of scholarship funds, including acceptable uses of the funds.
- Market and promote scholarships and provide an annual student application to be used by the colleges.
- Monitor the program for overall compliance including monitoring awards and transmittals made by colleges.
- Provide interim and end of the year reports to Golden LEAF including scholarship awarded and project activities and outcomes.
- Provide professional development and training opportunities to college aid administrators.

### **College Requirements**

- Announce and promote the Golden LEAF Community College Scholarship program to curriculum and workforce continuing education students.
- Determine application procedures including deadlines to apply for the scholarship.
- Comply with scholarship guidelines, including awarding, administration, and reconciliation of award transmittals with other offices and NCCCS.
- Maintain all Golden LEAF scholarship applications.

#### **Student Eligibility Requirements**

- Eligible students must (1) be a North Carolina resident, (2) demonstrate financial need and (3) reside in a rural county that is tobacco dependent, or economically destressed, as determined by the Golden LEAF Foundation (see Qualifying Counties 2023-2024). A scholarship recipient who resides in an eligible county upon initial award will retain eligibility and may be eligible for a renewal award as long as the student's place of residence is within the state of North Carolina. NOTE: the college will be asked to provide proof of the student's county of residency at the time of the initial award.
- Eligible students may receive an award each year. Financial aid offices will determine their application
  procedures for making awards for subsequent terms. Selected students will be required to disclose all
  financial aid awards as dictated by college financial aid offices for award packaging. Golden LEAF
  Scholarships will not displace federal grants, e.g., Pell grants, for which the student may be eligible (may
  displace loan funds).

### **Curriculum Student Selection Criteria**

### Eligible students must:

(1) Be enrolled at least full-time for fall and spring; Summer school students must be enrolled at least 6 credit hours. Grants for less-than-full-time students should be prorated based on hours of enrollment and pending availability of funds. Colleges should determine reasonable proration award amounts.

- (2) Demonstrate financial need as determined by completion of the FAFSA;
- (3) Be a resident of North Carolina
- (4) Reside in a rural county that is tobacco dependent, or economically destressed, as determined by the Golden LEAF Foundation (Please check with your financial aid office for Qualifying Counties 2023-2024).

### CU Scholarship Awarding Format Sample: THIS IS AN EXAMPLE.

Colleges may select students to receive up to \$2,250 in awards annually. For example, if a student receives \$2,250, funds will be awarded up to \$1,000 for the fall, \$1,000 for the spring and \$250 in the summer. The scholarship may be renewed for one year, if the student meets eligibility criteria.

If the student fails to enroll, those remaining funds may be awarded to another student. Grants for less-than-full-time students will be prorated based on hours of enrollment and pending availability of funds. For example, if a student is awarded \$2,250 for the fall and spring, but enrolls for only halftime for the spring semester, the award will be prorated for the spring to \$563. The remaining \$562 may be awarded to another student.

### **Workforce Continuing Education Student Eligibility**

Eligible students must:

- (1) Be a resident of North Carolina.
- (2) Reside in a qualifying Golden LEAF County.
- (3) Be enrolled or enrolling in Workforce Continuing Education (WCE) pathways/courses offered for 96 hours or more and leading to a State or industry-recognized credential.

### WCE Scholarship Awarding Format Sample: THIS IS AN EXAMPLE.

Colleges may select students to receive up to \$1,850 and must award according to the curriculum semester(s) as set up in Colleague for fall, spring, and summer. For example, a student may be awarded \$925 in the fall, based on CE course/program beginning in August. A student may be awarded \$925 in the spring, based on CE course/program beginning in January. If a course/program begins in December, the scholarship should be awarded under the fall semester/term in Colleague.

At least 25% of the college Golden LEAF allocation must be awarded to WCE students.

### **Application Process**

- The System Office will promote and market the scholarship among the local community colleges to help the students understand and recognize the mission of Golden LEAF. A marketing and publicity plan approved by the Foundation will include the scholarship notification letter sent to each scholar.
- Students will complete the Golden LEAF Community College application for the targeted academic year. Applications will be filed with the college financial aid offices or Workforce Continuing Education departments.
- Timing for the selection process is determined by the award policies and procedures of each college.
   Financial aid offices will work with Workforce Continuing Education departments to determine the awards periods for those students.
- Applicants bear full responsibility for completing the Golden LEAF application prior to each deadline.
- Financial aid offices will provide a list of selected recipients including name, amount, address, county, email, and program of study to the System Office as requested for reporting purposes.

### **George W. Ballard Memorial Scholarship**

### George W. Ballard Memorial Student Eligibility Criteria

One scholarship at \$500 for 2 years for students attending Guilford Technical Community College, Gaston Community College, or Alamance Community College and enrolling in a curriculum program. The funds may be distributed equally in two payments: fall semester and spring semester. Scholarship checks will be issued to the college. The North Carolina Community College System Office will notify and award the designated institution. To qualify as a candidate for the George W. Ballard Memorial Scholarship, a student must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Be personally eligible for in-state tuition.
- 2. Be enrolled (or must intend to enroll) in the Air Conditioning, Heating, and Refrigeration curriculum at a North Carolina community college.
- 3. Submit an essay stating why he/she chose the field of study and how the scholarship will help them financially attain their educational goal.
- 4. Maintain a cumulative grade point average at or above the level require for graduation.
- 5. Continue for the duration of the scholarship at the college where he/she was enrolled at the time of the scholarship award.

### **Application Process:**

- Colleges will submit the general scholarship application to the college's Financial Aid Office by Friday, September 15, 2023. The individual recipient of the scholarship will be selected by a scholarship committee at the North Carolina Community College System Office from the applications received.
- 2. Complete Scholarship Essay to briefly answer the following essay questions on a separate paper. Please type your responses to the essay.
  - O Why should you be considered for this scholarship?

Scholarship checks will be issued to the college in the name of the recipient. To qualify as a recipient for the Allen Ryan Todd Scholarship, an applicant must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Be a resident of a North Carolina.
- 2. Be enrolled (or must intend to enroll) in an associate degree program in education, health, or environmental science at a North Carolina Community College.
- 3. Be a motivated, capable learner who has a demonstrated economic need.
- 4. Submit an essay specifying a chosen field of study and explain how the scholarship will help the applicant achieve his/her goal. A statement of how his/her goals honor the values modeled in the life of Allen Ryan Todd.
- 5. Maintain a grade point average at or above the level required for graduation.
- 6. Continue enrollment for the duration of the scholarship at the college where he/she was enrolled at the time of the scholarship award.
- 7. The recipient(s) must show documentation that they have volunteered in the intended field of study to be considered for this scholarship. Documentation must be within the past year.

The recipients of the scholarship will be selected each year by a scholarship committee at the North Carolina Community College System Office. Factors to be considered in the selection process will include, but will not be limited to, scholastic achievement, participation in outside activities, and a demonstrated commitment to the students' chosen disciplines: Education, Health, or Environmental Science.

The Todd family and supporters hope recipients will regard this scholarship as an obligation to make the most of their career goals and as an opportunity to help others. We are looking for students who will model scholarship, leadership, and service in their own lives and serve as good models for future recipients of this financial aid. While we cannot always "pay it back," we can "pay it forward." We wish to support those who subscribe to this philosophy.

SECU Foundation established this **two-year scholarship program** to assist North Carolina Community College System (NCCCS) students in achieving academic success. The members of State Employees' Credit Union (SECU) take an active role in assisting organizations and communities across North Carolina and truly believe in "People Helping People!"

There are 116 scholarships valued at up to \$5,000 each. Each North Carolina Community College will receive two (2) scholarships each academic year. These scholarships are distributed semi-annually in two payments: fall semester, \$1,250 per student; and spring semester, \$1,250 per student for a maximum of four (4) consecutive semesters.

- Is an applicant or full-time student who is a high school graduate or has completed the General Education Development (GED) program, enrolled in an associate degree, diploma or certificate program.
- 2. Is a resident of North Carolina under NCGS 116-143.1 and is eligible for in-state tuition.
- 3. Applicant must not have previously been awarded the SECU 2-year People Helping People scholarship. Each year recipients selected must be new recipients of the scholarship.
- 4. Best exemplifies the membership philosophy of credit unions, "People Helping People" and has demonstrated leadership, excellence of character, integrity, and community involvement.



- 5. Demonstrates financial need using the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Preference may be given to students with limited financial aid from other programs.
- 6. Demonstrates scholastic achievement and maintains a 2.5 or higher-grade point average on a 4.0 scale or attained a score of 3,000 on the GED test.
- 7. Uses the scholarship to pay for full-time student tuition, books, fees, course supplies and transportation.
- 8. Agrees to continue at the community college where enrolled at the time of the scholarship award for the duration of the scholarship, for four consecutive fall/spring semesters or upon completion of a diploma program. Scholarships are <u>not transferable</u> to another student or another school.
- 9. Is not a director, employee, or family member of a director or employee of SECU or the SECU Foundation, or a family member of a member of the scholarship selection committee. For the purpose of this scholarship program and a student's relation to a director, employee, or selection committee member, family member includes spouse, parents, siblings, children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren, and spouses of children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren, of a selection committee member, employee or director of SECU, or employee or director of SECU Foundation. Also, for the purpose of this scholarship program and a student's relation to a director, employee, or selection committee member, family member also includes persons living in the same residence and maintaining a single economic unit as a selection committee member, employee or director of SECU, or employee or director of SECU Foundation.

- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.studentaid.gov
- Complete the NC Community Colleges General Scholarship Application form.
- Submit an essay explaining your interest in the life science field of study, your goals after graduation, and how the scholarship will help you financially.
- Scholarship applications must be received by Friday, July 7, 2023.

Scholarship applications should be submitted to the student's local community college financial aid office by July 16th. The financial aid office will submit all applications to the NC Community College System. Recipients of the scholarships will be selected each year by the scholarship committee of the North Carolina Community College System along with two individuals designated by NCBIO. Factors considered in the selection process include but are not limited to financial need, scholarship achievement, designated goals, and demonstrated interest in pursuing a life science career in North Carolina. Scholarship candidates shall be selected, and the scholarships awarded without regard to race, gender, color, creed, religious preference, age, national origin or disability.

### T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood Scholarship Program

NOTE: This is an announcement for the T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood Scholarship. NCCCS is not responsible for the collection or selection of scholarship applications for this program.

T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood (Teacher Education and Compensation Helps) Scholarship Program was developed to upgrade the level of education of teachers working with young children while making the educational process affordable, increasing wages and reducing turnover.

This scholarship program offers scholarship funds to take courses at any of North Carolina's Community Colleges that offer an Associate Degree in Early Childhood Education program. Alternately, this scholarship can also help those in need of 9-15 transferable credit hours for entrance to a North Carolina state college/university, after completing their early childhood associate degree. It is a partnership between the child care provider, sponsoring center, and T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood® North Carolina that enables providers to improve their skills, receive a financial reward and continue the availability of quality child care in local communities. Associate scholarships are available for family home providers, child care center teachers and directors, plus part-day program (facility operating 30 hours or less per week) teachers. Scholarships are awarded on the basis of need and commitment to the Early Childhood Education field, as shown through information on the application.

### **Student Eligibility Requirements**

- 1) Any teacher, director, or home provider who would like to enroll in coursework in Early Childhood Education at a community college and who is employed full-time (30 hours/week minimum) in a licensed child care facility is eligible to apply for a scholarship.
- 2) Any child care teacher working in a part-day program who would like to attend a community college (to earn a certificate, diploma, or A.A.S. in early childhood education) and who has worked at the sponsoring program for at least 9 months is eligible for a scholarship. Applicants must be currently employed at least 20-30 hours per week; and be without a degree in early childhood or child development.
- 3) Any teacher, director, or home provider who employed full-time (30 hours/week minimum) in a licensed child care facility and has already completed their Early Childhood Education Associate Degree and needs an additional 9-15 transferable credit hours in order to enter a North Carolina state college/university.
